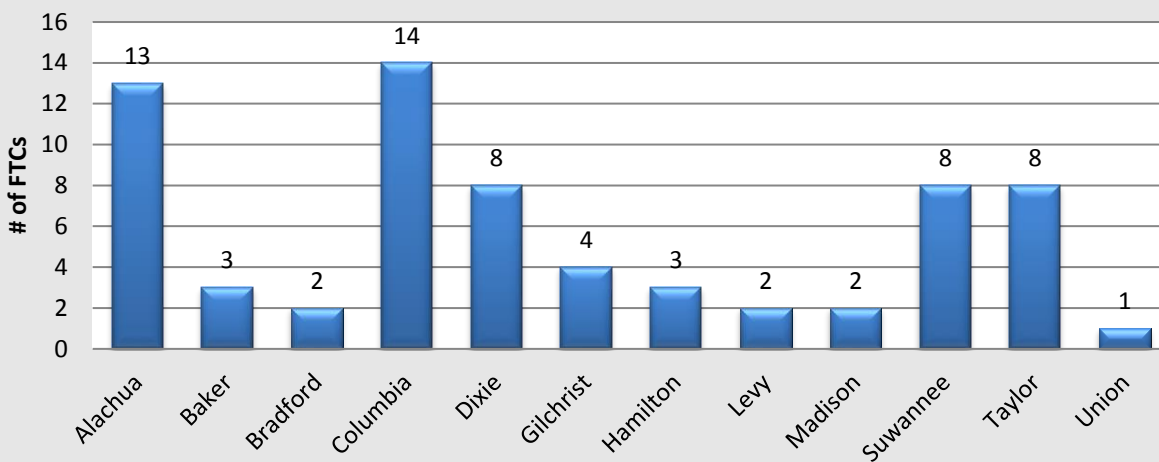
Data for Q3, 2017

July 1, 2017- September 30, 2017

Data Highlights:

- Total number of **FTCs completed** during this period: 68
 - 26 (38%) of these were for Non- Judicial cases and 42 (62%) were for Shelter cases
 - 100% of the FTCs were planned and facilitated by FTC staff members
 - In addition, 6 cases had Safety Management Conferences (SMCs), as part of a pilot in Alachua County, facilitated by FTC staff
 - 14 (20.5%) FTCs were exempt
 - 11 (78.5%) were for judicial cases and 3 (21.5%) were for non- judicial cases
 - Reasons for Exemption:
 - 22% Family resides outside of catchment area
 - 22% Other- mostly due to recommendation from CLS or CMA
 - 21% Parent Incarcerated
 - 14% Unable to contact client
 - 14% Family declines FTC
 - 7% Client has no working contact information
- **Participants:**
 - Average number of attendees is 4.7 people (including Facilitator and FCC)
 - Average number of non-professional attendees is 2.5 people
 - This ratio is in accordance with our target that professional participants will not outnumber family supports who attend FTCs
- 91 **unique service types** were authorized from FTCs completed during this period in the following service type categories:
 - 55% Mental Health
 - 16% Parenting
 - 14% Substance Abuse
 - 10% Domestic Violence
 - 5% Other
- The average number of **calendar days to complete FTCs** was 28.21 days (target is 25 calendar days)
 - Reasons for Late FTCs
 - 40% Client rescheduled FTC
 - 35% Case direction undetermined
 - 25% FTC Prep Staffing delayed
