

Family Team Conferencing

Data for Q4, 2017 October 1, 2017- December 31, 2017

Data Highlights:

- Total number of **FTCs completed** during this period: 66
 - o 35 (53%) of these were for Non-Judicial cases and 31 (47%) were for Shelter cases
 - o 100% of the FTCs were planned and facilitated by FTC staff members
 - In addition, 11 cases had Safety Management Conferences (SMCs), as part of a pilot in Alachua County, facilitated by FTC staff
 - 19 (22.3%) FTCs were **exempted**
 - 17 (89.5%) were for judicial cases and 2 (10.5%) were for non-judicial cases
 - Reasons for Exemption:
 - 30% Family declines FTC
 - 20% Family resides outside of catchment area
 - 15% Other- mostly due to recommendation from CLS or CMA
 - 15% Parent Incarcerated
 - 15% Client has no working contact information
 - 5% Client no shows to scheduled appointment

• Participants:

- o Average number of attendees is 4.3 people (including Facilitator and FCC)
- Average number of non-professional attendees is 2.4 people
- This ratio is in accordance with our target that professional participants will not outnumber family supports who attend FTCs
- 58 **unique service types** were authorized from FTCs completed during this period in the following service type categories:
 - o 59% Mental Health
 - o 19% Domestic Violence
 - o 10% Parenting
 - 0 9% Substance Abuse
 - o 3% Other
- The average number of calendar days to complete FTCs was 27.32 days (target is 25 calendar days)
 - o Reasons for Late FTCs
 - 39% Client rescheduled FTC
 - 39% Case direction undetermined
 - 11% FTC Prep Staffing delayed
 - 11% Staff Capacity
