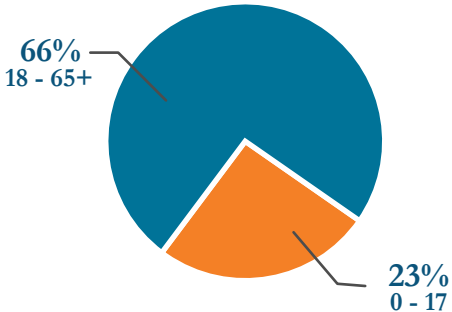

Every service offered is tied to a **PROTECTIVE FACTOR**, which when present in families are shown to **REDUCE THE LIKELIHOOD OF ABUSE OR NEGLECT.**

The protective factors, listed by patron access rate, are:

Concrete Supports in Times of Need (57%)

Social Connections (15%)

Knowledge of Parenting & Child Development (13%)

Family Functioning & Resiliency (11%)

Nurturing & Attachment (4%)
