This fiscal year PSF's Licensing team was tasked with licensing 43 new homes. We are proud to announce that we reached our goal. The team worked together diligently in great strides to make this happen. We would like to thank the Partner Families who referred four of our new homes. Those Partner Families who helped recruit received an incentive of \$125. It is not much



incentive of \$125. It is not much, but we really appreciate their zeal in recruiting quality families for our children.

Our Faith Partners contributed to three new homes, and PSF staff referred two of our new homes. Please remember that all Partner Families, PSF employees, CMA employees, GAL volunteers and DCF staff are eligible for the \$125 incentive for each family referred who becomes a licensed Partner Family. Payment will be made once the family has accepted their first child in placement.

Although we have attained our goal for the fiscal year, there are still homes to be recruited and children who are in need of loving, caring families. We believe that word of mouth goes a long way. Continue to spread the word about becoming a Partner Family.

CLOTHING ALLOWANCES

Checks are issued directly to Partner Families and are processed prior to the new school year. They are usually processed just before tax-free week so that Partner Families can take advantage of the savings.

Clothing allowances are issued to kids who have been in care for six months. If the six month time comes after the allowances go out, they will be eligible to receive it at their six month mark.



STEP UP FOR STUDENTS

Step Up For Students provides scholarships for low-income Florida schoolchildren, children who are in foster care and children who are homeless enrolled in grades K-12.

Many families still don't know this option exists, but Florida has the

nation's largest tax credit scholarship program, giving low-income families the ability to choose the K-12 school that best meets their child's needs.

Step Up For Students is a non-profit organization that administers the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program. The program was created in 2001 by the Florida Legislature, and is funded by corporations that receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit for their contributions.

Since 2002, more than 330,000 scholarships have been awarded to low-income Florida students in grades K-12, including approximately 60,000 for the 2013-14 school year. Families can choose between two scholarship options:

- •A scholarship to help cover private school tuition and fees, worth up to \$4,880.
- •A scholarship to assist with transportation costs to attend a public school in another county, worth up to \$500.

(Scholarship amounts for the 2013-14 school year are noted. The amounts may increase for the 2014-15 school year.)

The scholarship also has special guidelines for children who are in foster care or who are homeless.

Step Up For Students applications are now available. Parents may visit www. StepUpForStudents.org for additional details and to apply for the Step Up For Students Scholarship for the 2014-15 school year.

If a parent is interested in the program, but won't have children starting kindergarten or meeting all the eligibility requirements until the 2015-16 school year, they can sign up for the 2015-16 school year interest list by visiting ww.StepUpForStudents.org.

CLIENT TRUST FUNDS

If you have a child with a client trust fund, or believe that a child in your home should have a trust fund, please contact Pamela Hart with any questions or concerns at 352-244-1545. Currently, she is part-time so if you have an emergency please contact Amanda Gray at 352-244-1511.

TRAVEL

Foster Parent Travel logs are due on a monthly basis. Travel submitted past two months will not be eligible for payment. All travel requires supporting documentation. For more information please contact our Licensing AA at (352) 244-1548.

BLUE FOLDERS

Each child is required to come to your home with a placement letter stating the child is being placed in your care with a blue folder containing the child's legal and medical information. Contact your FCC or Placement Specialist as soon as possible if the child has not arrived with these items.
