PARTNER SPOTLIGHT -NORTHSTAR FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

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With the holiday season on the horizon, it's time for Partnership for Strong Families (PSF) and our community of supporters to start preparing for our Wish Upon a Star holiday toy drive! This incredible giving opportunity provides donors with the chance to spread some holiday cheer to youth in care during what can be a challenging holiday season for them. This year, we anticipate serving approximately 1,100 children!

Here are a few ways our supporters can help:

- SPONSOR A WISH LIST(S): Shop for gifts from a child's wish list. Each donor is asked to purchase at least two of the child's wishes to value at least \$60. Wish list sponsors may participate in one of two ways:
 - SHOP IN-PERSON: You may shop for a child's gifts in-person and drop off the gifts to us. In order to expedite the process of getting presents to the children we serve, we ask that donors please return the gifts unwrapped. Details on drop-off location and time will be arranged with our donors.
 - SHOP VIA AMAZON WISH LIST: If you would like to shop from the comfort of your own home, we can also share a specific link to Amazon for you to shop from and have the gifts shipped directly to us.
- MAKE A MONETARY DONATION Provide a monetary donation and we will do the shopping for you, or you can ask us about our business sponsorship opportunities.
- PURCHASE GENERAL TOYS Donate general new toys to help us supplement for sibling groups and make their gifts as equal as possible.

Resource Center Spotlight - Tyrone Mullins

The 2024 Annual Back2School Bash, sponsored by NorthStar Family Resource Center and the Community Barbers, exceeded all goals and expectations. Nearly 800 children received backpacks and school supplies, and over 200 received haircuts.

Tyrone Mullins, one of the owners of Jazzy Cuts Barber Shop launched the first event 9 years ago in 2015. At that time, the event was held at the Richardson Community Center, then moved to Niblack Elementary School. In 2021, the event was moved back to Richardson Community Center. The annual event began with only 4 barbers from one barber shop and has grown to 20 barbers from most of the barber shops in Lake City.

Tyrone and his wife Thayla work very hard to ensure that this event goes smoothly. From securing volunteers, school supplies, and vendors, to organizing, setting up and breaking down the space. This year, Tyrone and his crew set up 20 barber stations in the Richardson Gymnasium.

Tyrone's commitment to the Back2School Bash is unwavering. Even during the COVID epidemic, he facilitated a method to ensure the event could happen safely. When Hurricane Debbie threatened this year's event, it seemed like it might not happen. However, Tyrone's determination prevailed. Despite the personal loss of his grandfather the day before the event, Tyrone worked throughout the event with the same enthusiasm while providing emotional support to his family, especially his grandmother.

Adoptions Updates

We love to celebrate our adoptive families during National Adoption Month in November each year. From July 2023 through June 2024, PSF was able to assist in finalizing the adoption of 163 children from within the 13 counties PSF serves, as well as an additional 31 children whose cases originated outside the PSF serve area. During National Adoption Month, we will hold a National Adoption Event (location and date to be determined), as well as our **10th Annual Superhero 5K** scheduled on November 3, 2024, at 8:30 a.m. at the Albert Ray Massey (Westside) Park. As we do each year, we will share success stories from our adoptive families and encourage and support our community members in exploring how to begin their own adoption journey.





University of Florida Campaign for Charity

The University of Florida Campaign for Charities (UFCC) runs from September 30 to October 18, encouraging faculty and staff to donate, but everyone is welcome to contribute. By donating to PSF during this campaign, you can help us secure additional funds for programs supporting youth in care and families connected to our Network of Family Resource Centers. You can choose to donate to a specific charity or make an undesignated donation, which will be allocated to nonprofits based on the number of designated donations they receive. The more designated donations PSF receives, the higher the percentage of undesignated funds we will receive. In 2023, we raised 27% more thanks to our dedicated donors! For example, a \$35 donation can provide a backpack for a child in foster care, helping them feel more confident in school. A \$50 donation can supply a new pair of shoes for a child who just entered foster care, while a \$100 donation can offer a utility credit to encourage participation in programs that promote self-sufficiency, such as financial literacy courses and employability workshops. The backpacks are filled and 550 local youth in foster care are off to school prepared to excel. Youth in foster care face many hurdles when it comes to completing their education, including the reality of moving schools and being preoccupied by the status of their case. Preparing the youth we serve with the supplies they need helps them avoid the stigma and barrier of not having what they need to complete their assignments. Resource Center Updates

Community Partner Networking Fairs

In July and August, respectively, our Family Resource Centers hosted the Tri-County and Gainesville Community Partner Networking Fairs. These annual events provide an opportunity for us to celebrate partnerships, while at the same time allowing us to learn more about many of the amazing resources available in our communities! Unlike other networking fairs, during these events partners table and share information about their services with other community serving partners. This helps to promote the concept of wrap-around services, remove silos and encourage partner agencies to work together in creative ways as they support local children and families. With more than 30 partners attending each event, they were a great success for all who attended. Hurricane Impact

This hurricane season has hit our area particularly hard. Our Resource Centers, especially those in Tri-County and Columbia County, mobilized to meet the needs of residents devastated by Hurricane Helene. 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Mental Health Insights

Specific to Youth in Care

Studies show that youth in foster care are two and a half times more likely to contemplate suicide than youth not in foster care and four times more likely to attempt suicide. Building research indicates a strong connection between childhood abuse or trauma and increased risk of mental health concerns, suicide attempts and completions. A youth's physical, emotional, or psychological trauma stems from abuse, neglect, domestic violence, or substance use in the home prior to removal. PSF works to reduce the impact of trauma in multiple ways, including the work of our Clinical Services team.

Did you know that up to 80% of children in Foster Care have significant mental health concerns compared to approximately 18-22% of the general population, according to the 2019 National Conference of State Legislatures?

The Clinical Services team is dedicated to making sure that children who need intensive treatment can access the services they need. They provide clinical expertise and support to our case managers, identifying appropriate services based on the children's needs. They facilitate regular staffings to monitor the treatment for children in higher levels of care and serve as liaisons to our expert mental health and psychiatric providers. Our community can assist through donations that can fund specific interventions not funded by insurance. Helping children heal from trauma is one of the amazing outcomes we get to be a part of and is vital to achieving permanency and stability.

Kelsey's Korner



Since joining PSF in 2022, I have had the good fortune of collaborating with Stacey Steinberg at the University of Florida Levin College of Law's GatorTeam Child clinical program to develop an externship for law students interested in child welfare law. The students focus on case reviews for youth at risk of aging out of care without permanence. They have also been developing a series of one-page documents that address some of the aspects of the dependency system that can be confusing and translating them into more understandable language with clear explanations about how the law works in practice. They are cutting through the legalese and acronyms that can lead to misunderstandings and providing useful information for youth, caregivers, and case managers.

Initially, they addressed emancipation, which is a pathway youth sometimes ask about that is often not a realistic possibility given the legal requirements. They also did a comparison of the juvenile and adult criminal systems, as often questions come up regarding the two systems and the difference in consequences after you turn 18. These one-pagers were geared toward assisting case managers who often field questions from youth in these areas. The interns have also worked on some documents for information that must be provided to youth in the Independent Living program in an effort to present the concepts in a clear fashion. The law student externs are now turning their attention to providing clarity around what it means when the goal in a dependency case changes from reunification to adoption or permanent guardianship. It is important to share the legal and procedural requirements so that caregivers can understand all that must happen before one of these alternative goals can be finalized. I'm grateful for this dynamic partnership with GatorTeam Child and the opportunity to provide practical experience for the next generation of lawyers who will be joining our ranks and bringing fresh energy and enthusiasm to their chosen areas of practice.
