OUR PURPOSE

Our purpose at The Library Partnership is to help you find the answers to your family's questions and connect your family to the resources you need. We are also here to assist families and individuals in the promotion and building of a strong family-focused community. The Library Partnership utilizes the six Protective Factors - nurturing and attachment, knowledge of parenting and child development, parental resilience, social connectedness, concrete supports and social and emotional compentence of children - to provide a framework for strengthening families.

A FEW OF OUR PROGRAMS

"Fight for Your Money" – Our financial literacy class. Participants will be immersed in a week-long educational workshop where participants learn subjects such as budgeting, banking, savings, credit repair and much more.

Job Fair and Career Days – Job fairs are held at the center and are open to the community. There is also a job board posted in the facility featuring available positions at various local employers, and the Library Partnership staff provides resume building, job search skills and interview technique assistance.

Additionally, families can apply for assistance programs such as Medicaid and Food Stamps at the center. The following services are also offered regularly: clothing closet, free faxing, free notary services, basic computer

classes, homework assistance, credit repair and employment workshops, children's activities, parenting workshops, free tax preparation assistance (seasonal) and more.

OUR GOALS

Values Children

We will offer services that provide children a healthy start both physically and emotionally through programs such as school readiness activities, Healthy Start services, child development classes and infant screening and diagnostic services.

Strengthens Families

We will offer parent-child activities to help parents learn the importance of early interaction with their children, tutoring and mentoring programs, relative caregiver support and an array of services to help families avoid a crisis or respond to a crisis.

Engages the Community

We will offer a place for community members to meet and interact, while encouraging local involvement through service learning opportunities.
