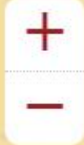

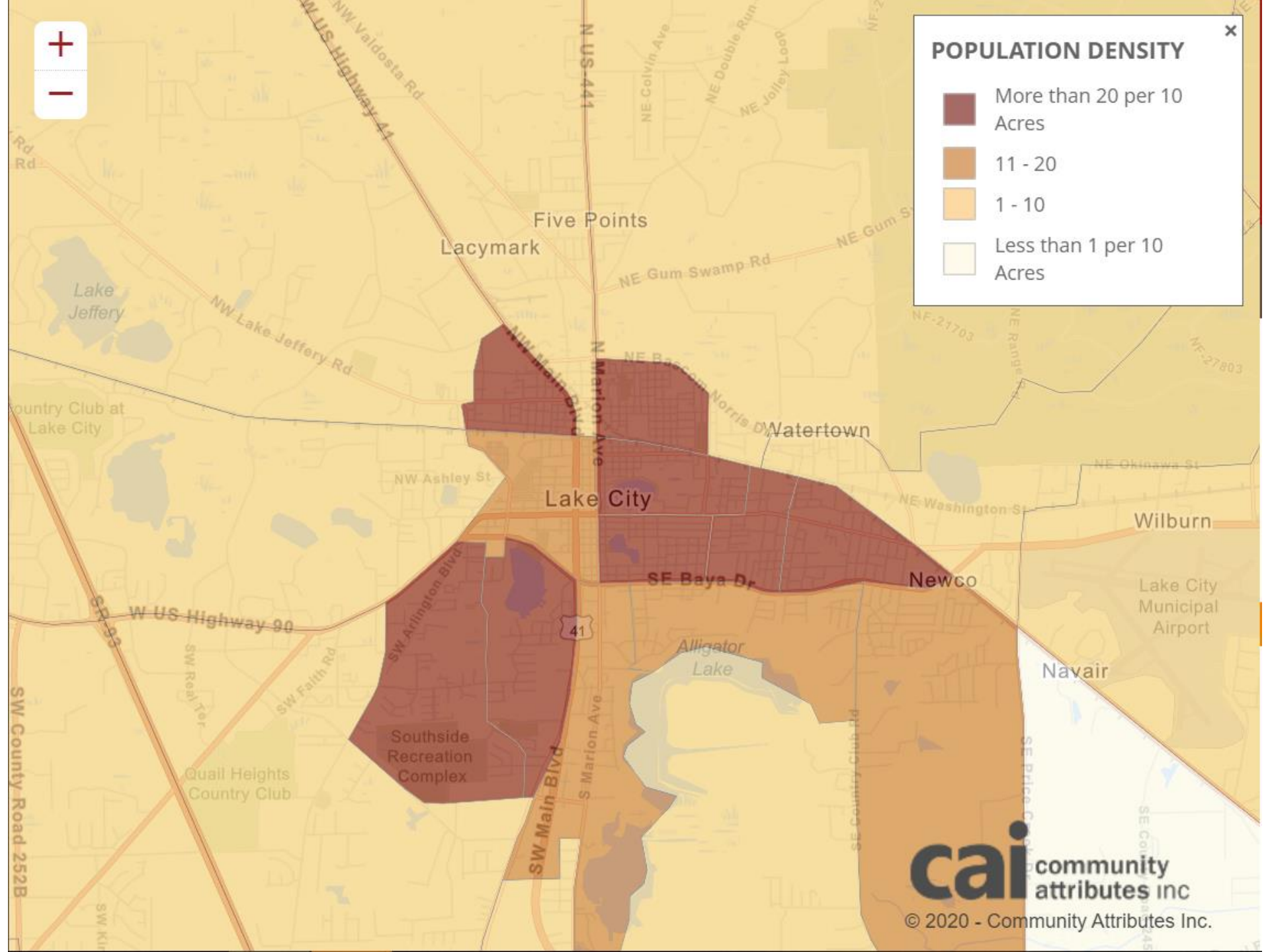

POPULATION DENSITY

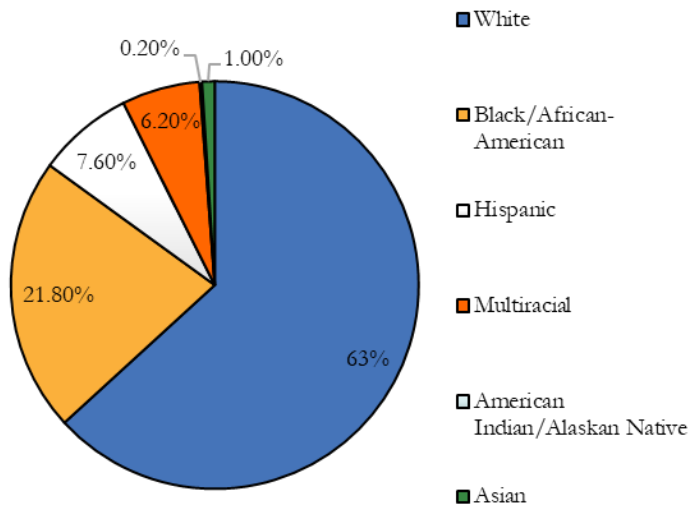

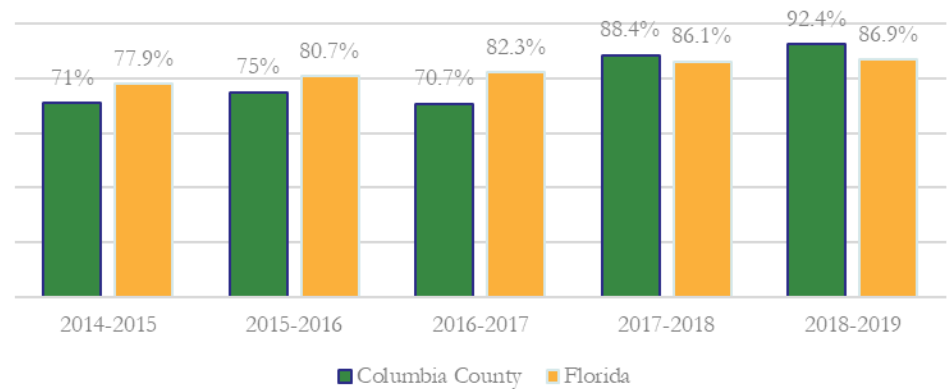

Columbia County and Florida Graduation Rates

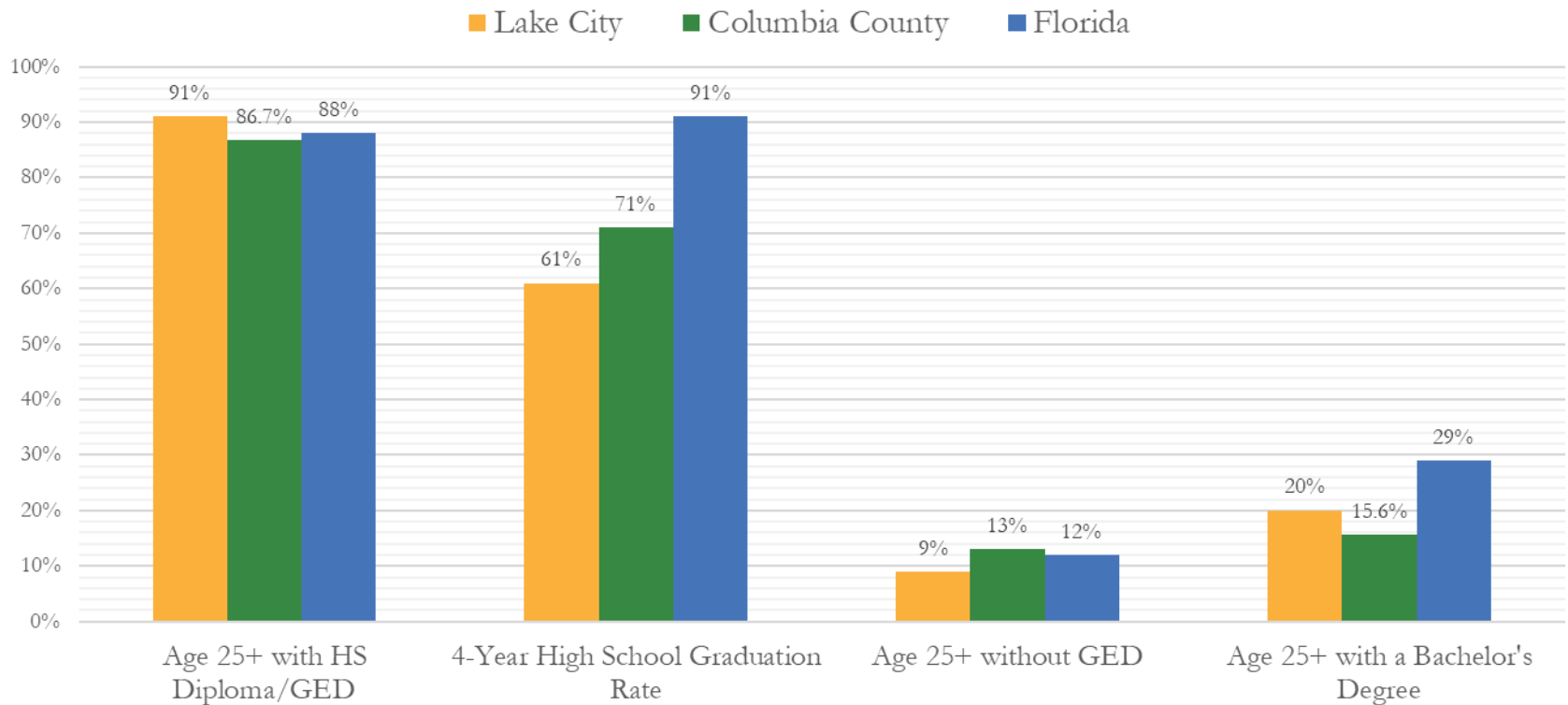

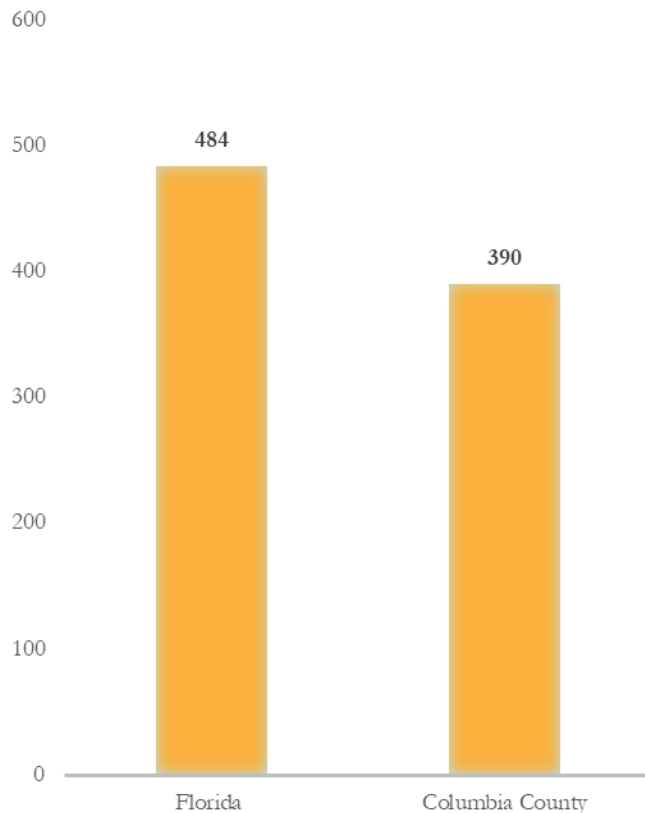
Educational Attainment Figures for Lake City, Columbia County, and Florida, 2014-2018

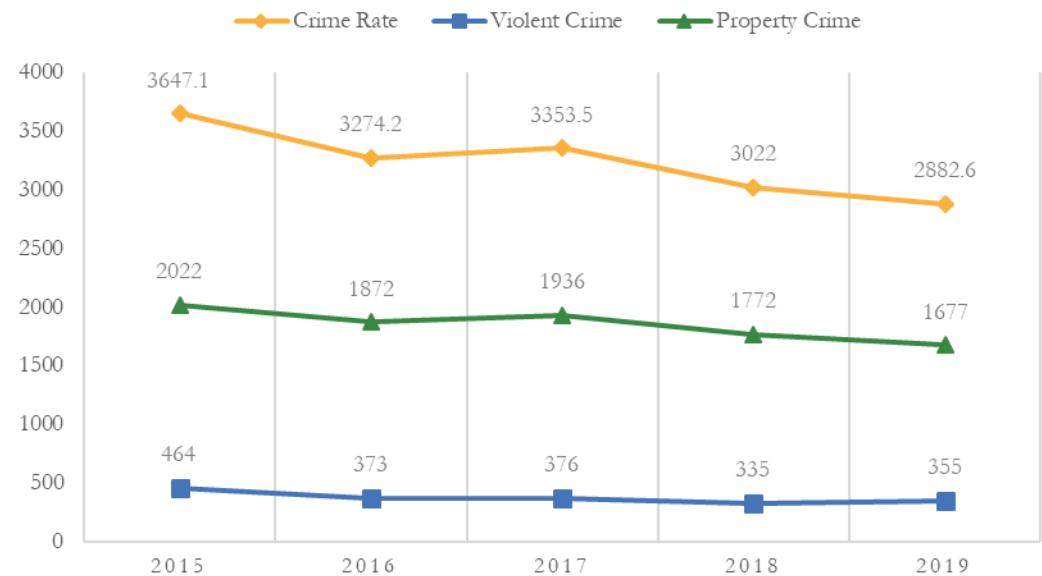

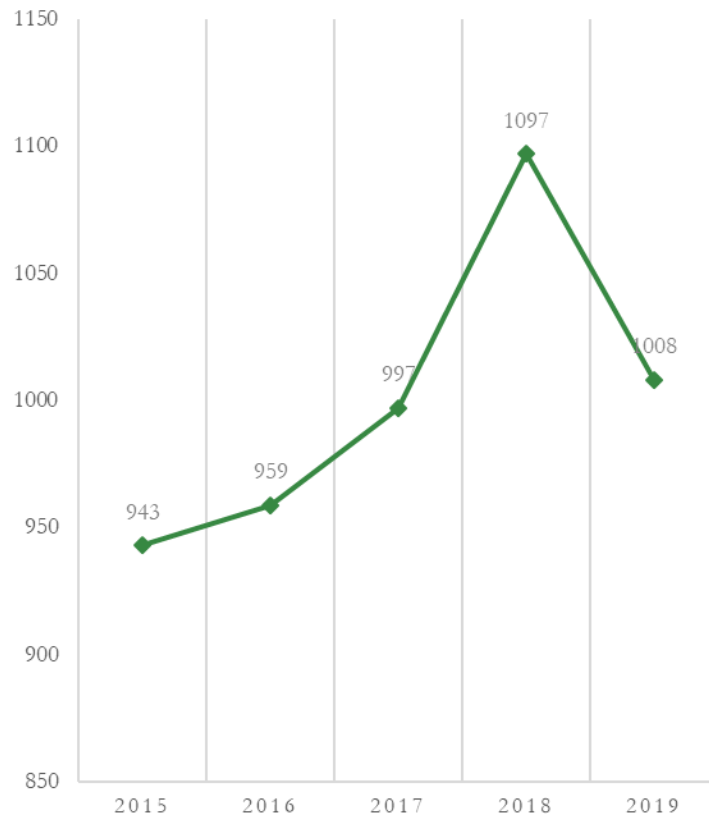
COLUMBIA COUNTY CRIME FIGURES, 2015-2019



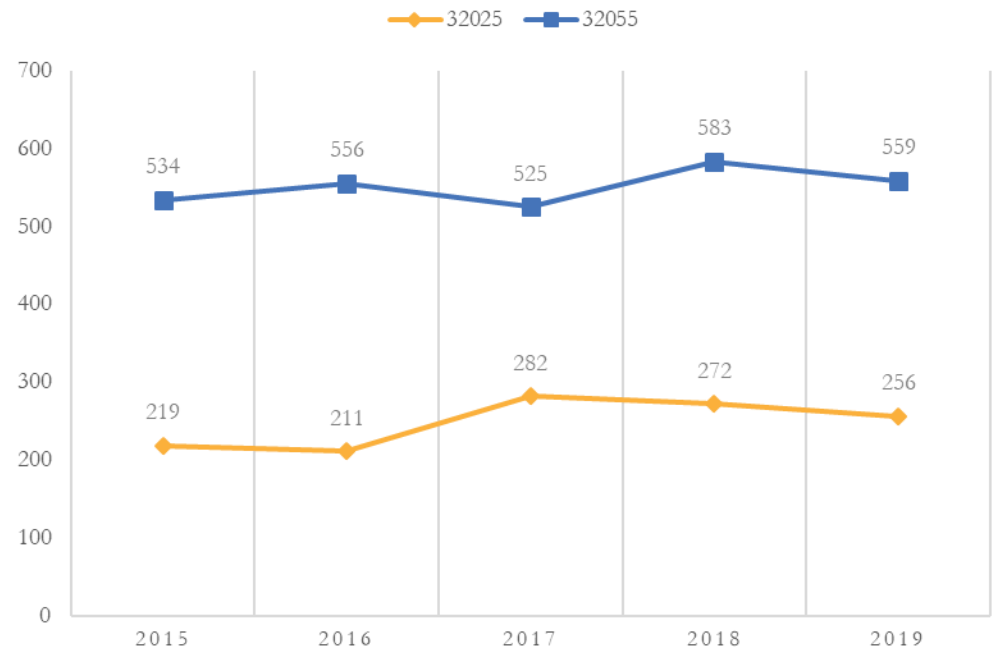

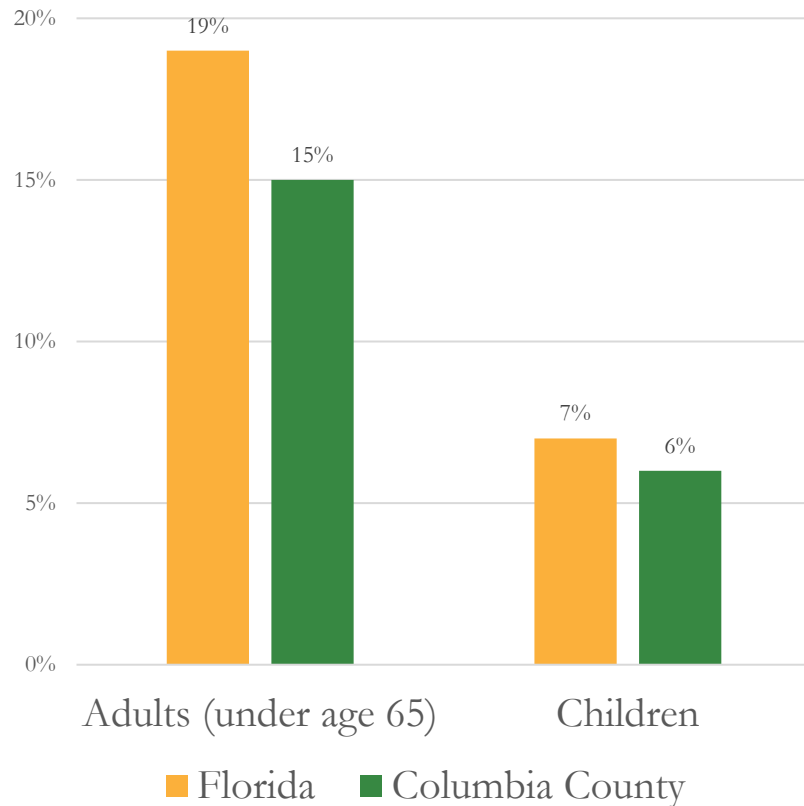


**LAKE CITY ADULT ARRESTS BY

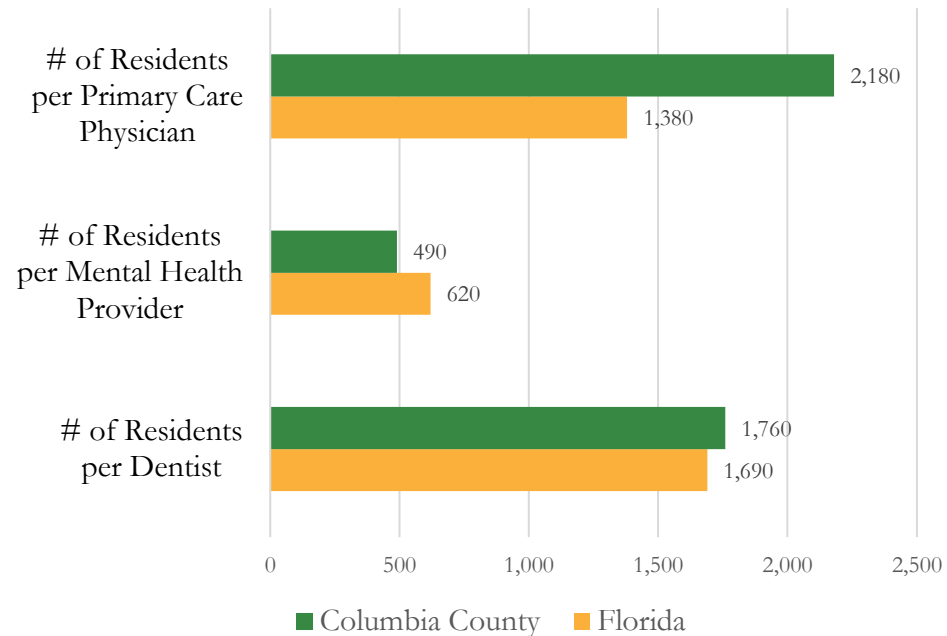


Health Care Access: Columbia County

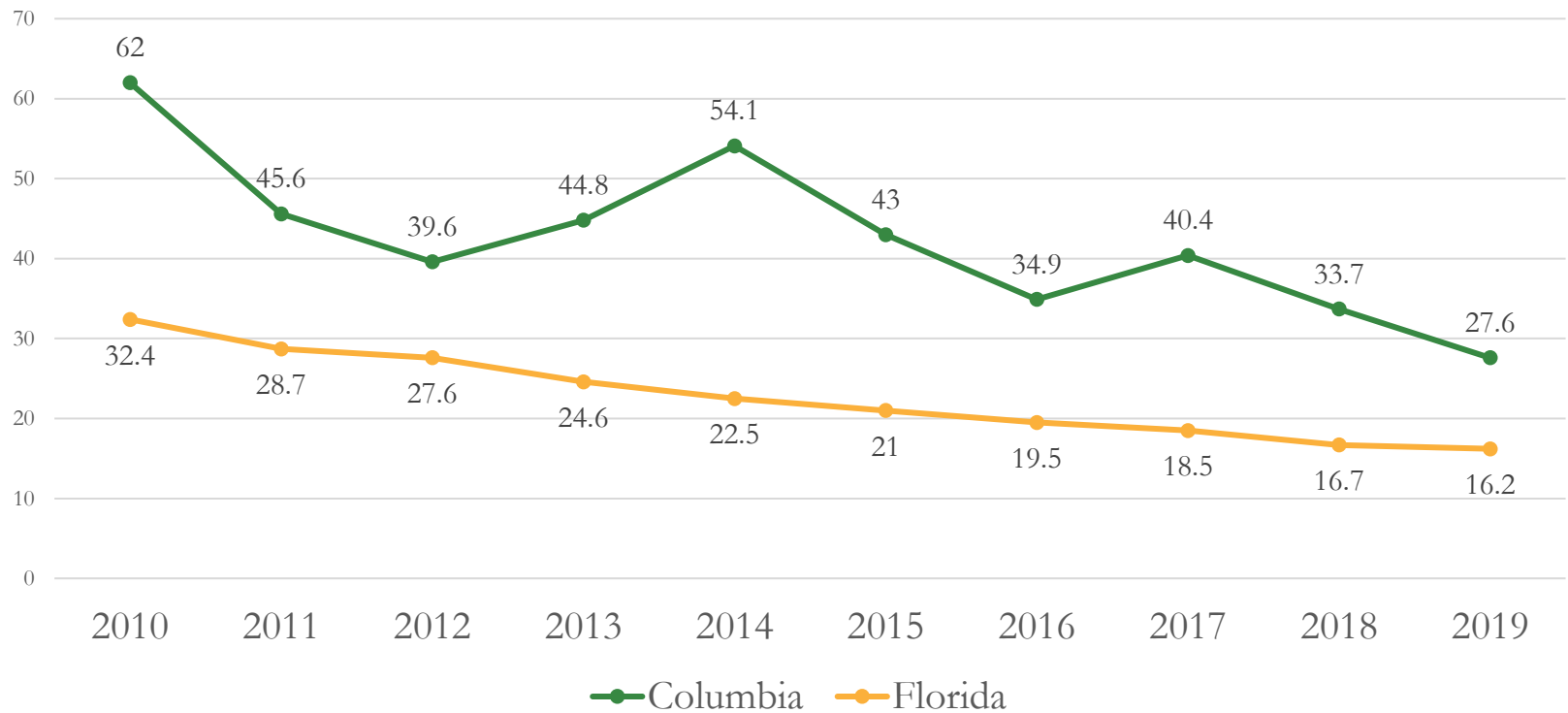
Ratio of Population to Health Care Providers

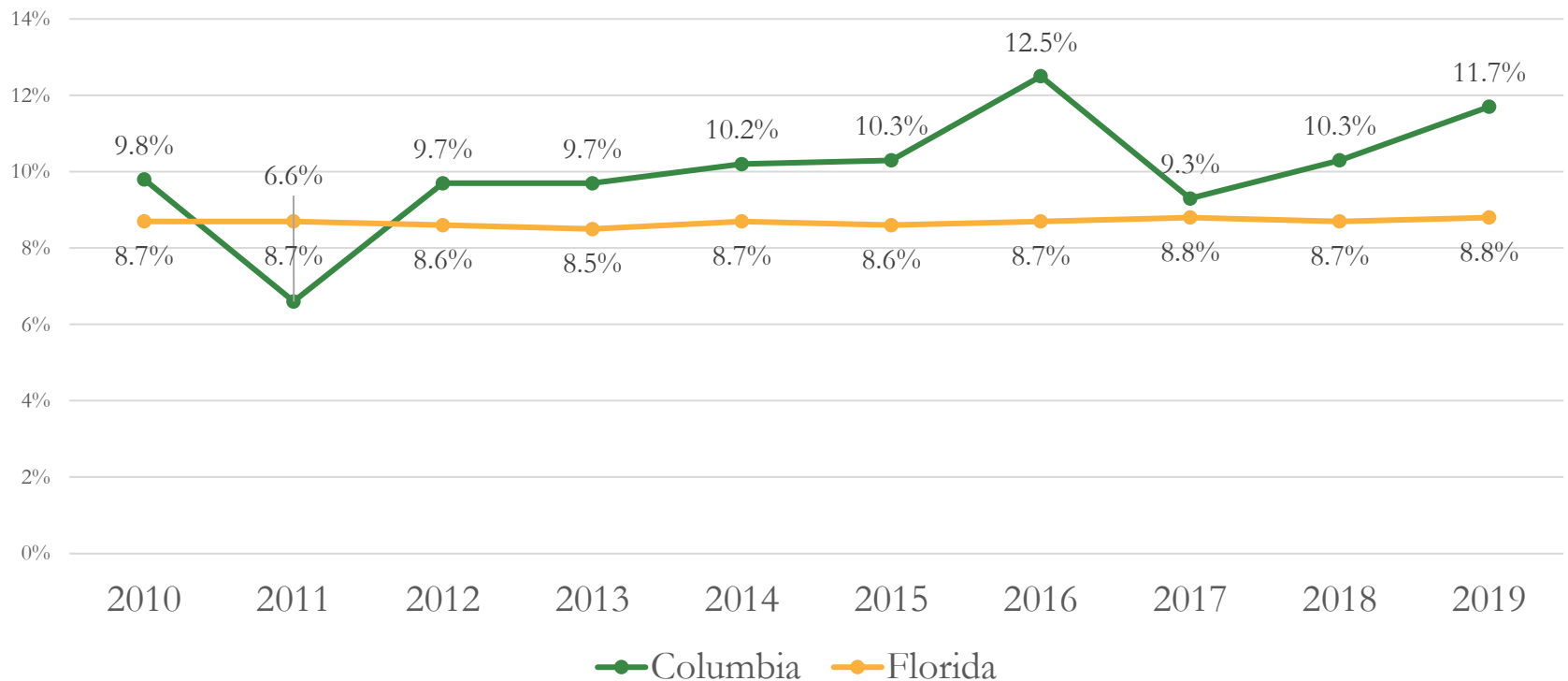
Births to Mothers ages 15 - 19

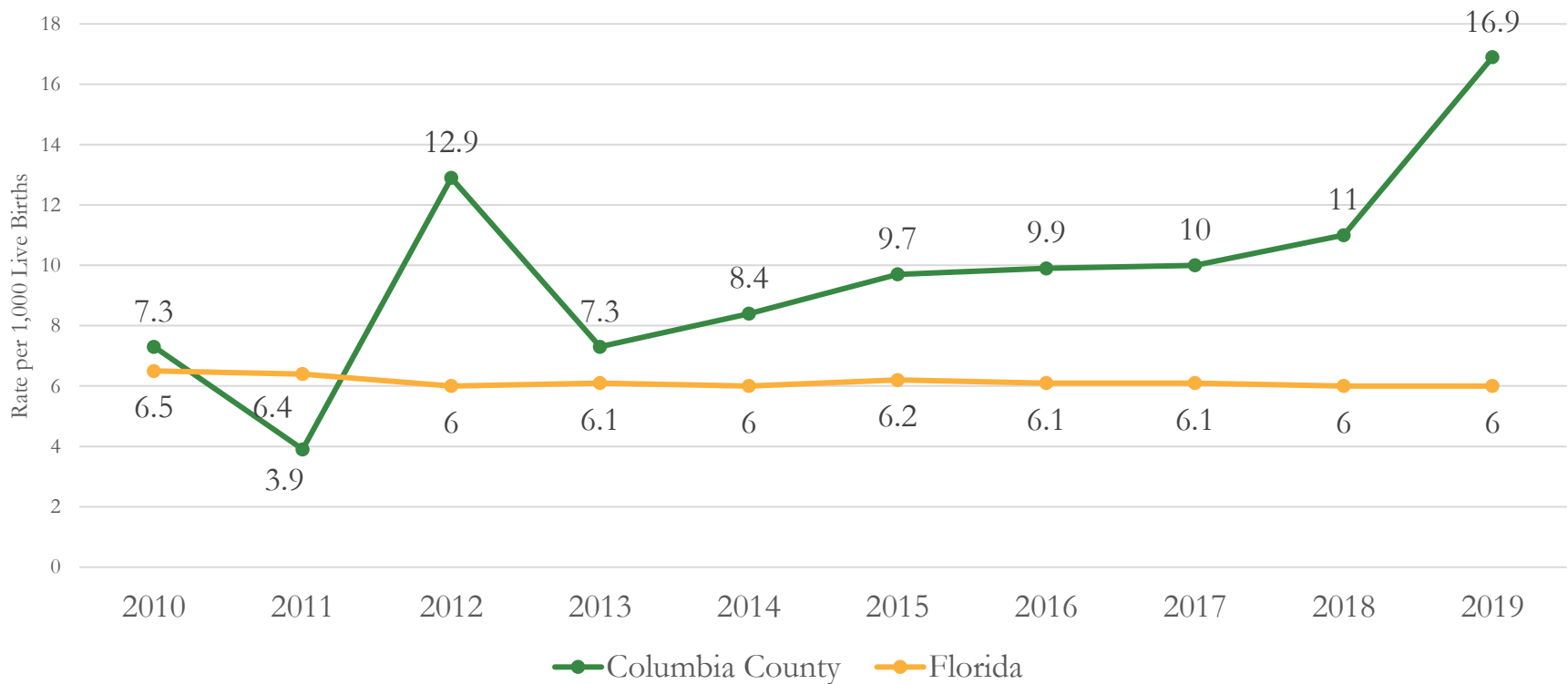
Births with Low Birthweight

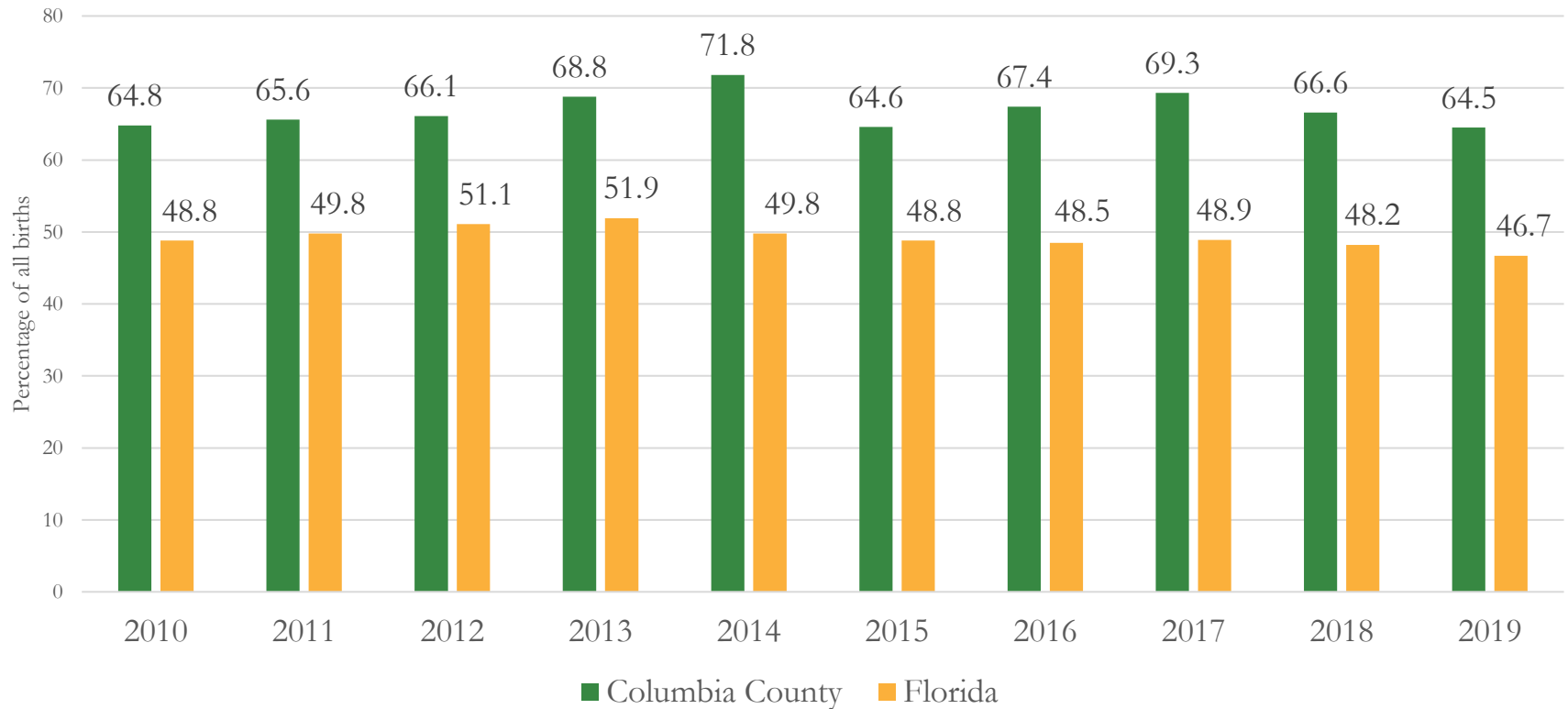
Infant Mortality Rate

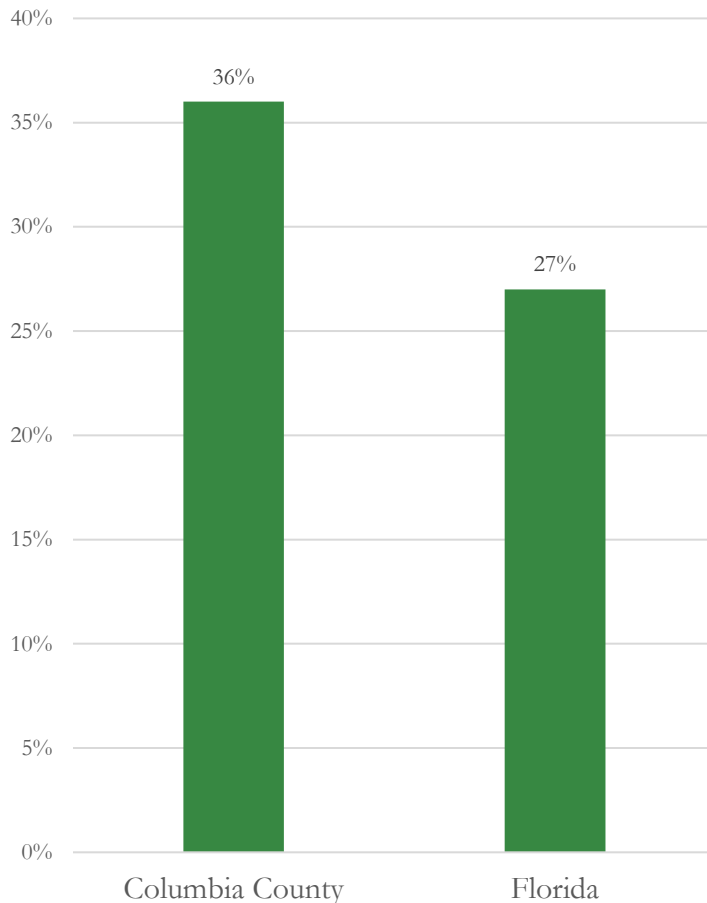
Percentage of Births Covered by Medicaid

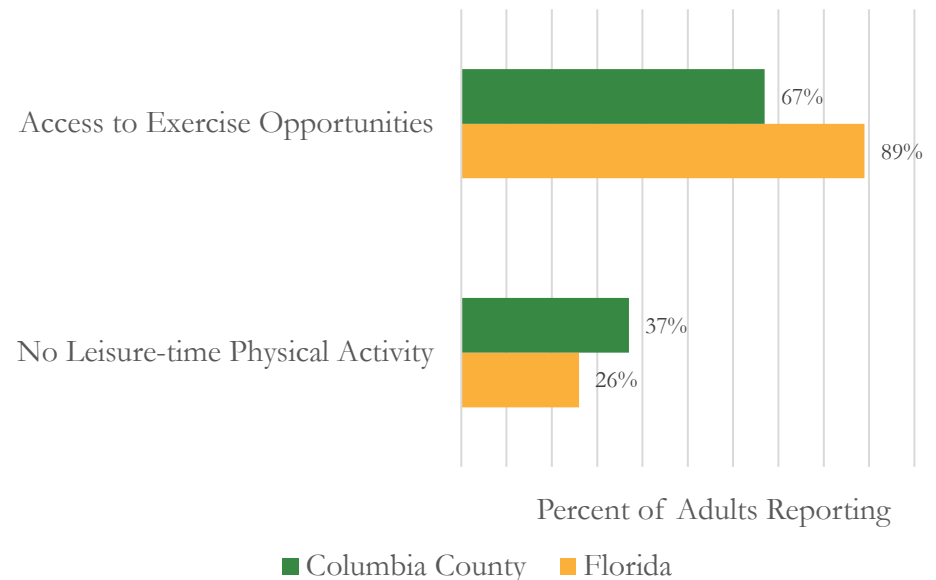


Physical Activity

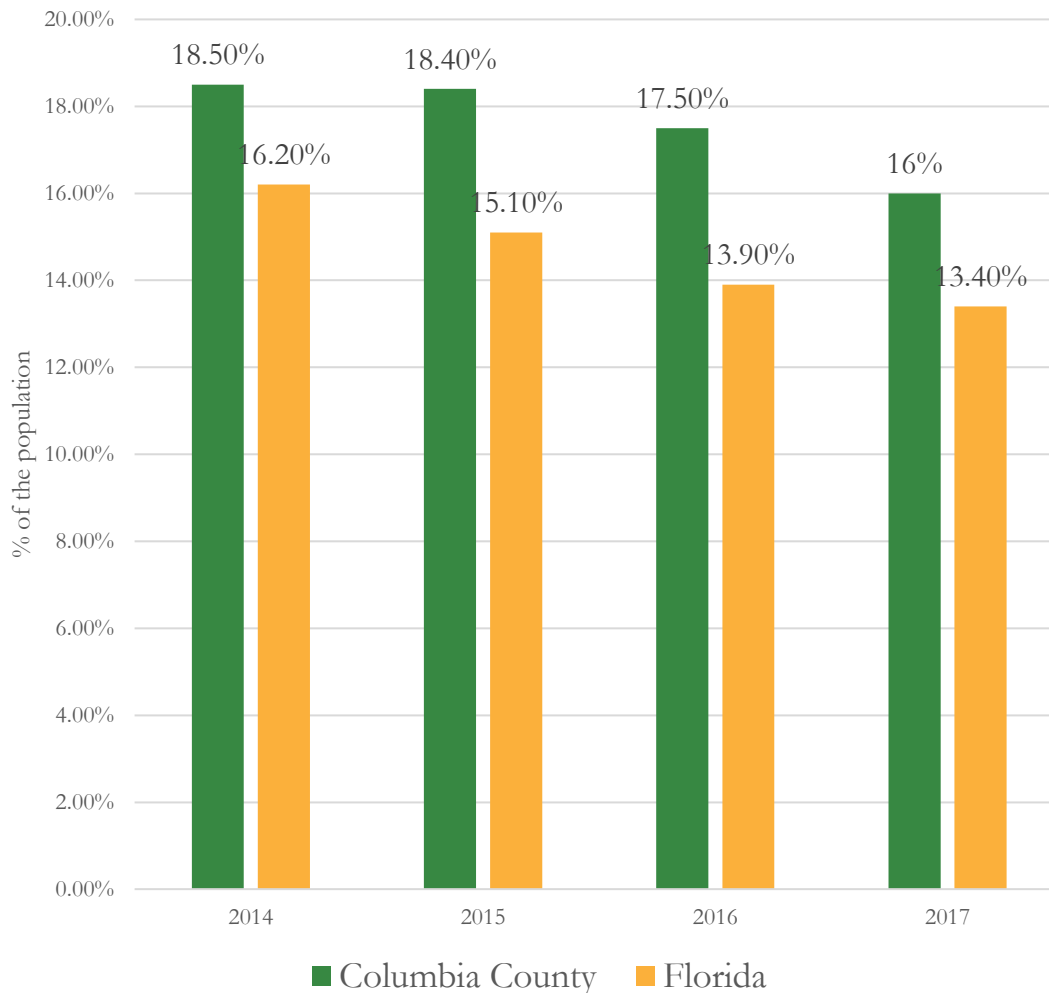

- Four of the 12 census tracts in Columbia County are considered food deserts by USDA guidelines of low-income populations and low access to supermarkets.
- A majority area in Columbia County, northeast of the Richardson Community Center (RCC), is categorized as a food desert. There is also a small census tract southwest of the RCC that is in a food desert.

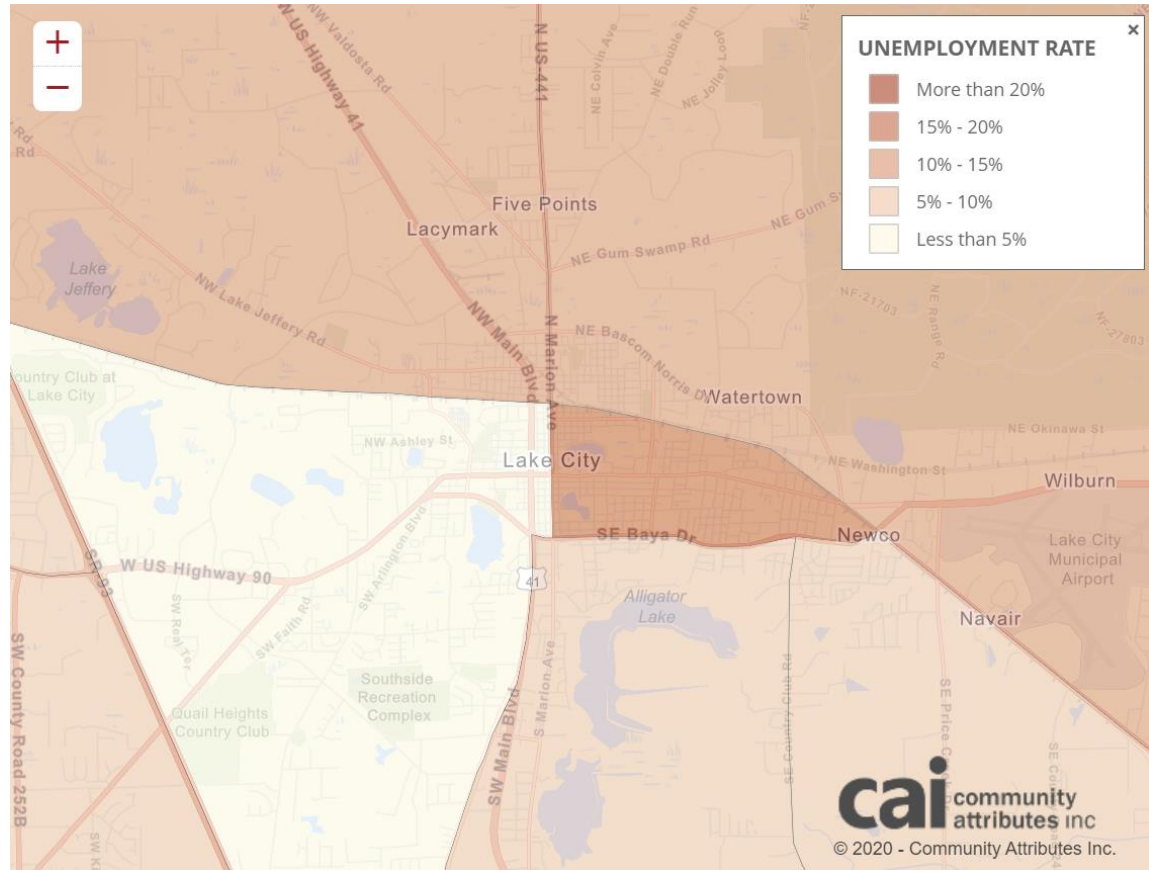
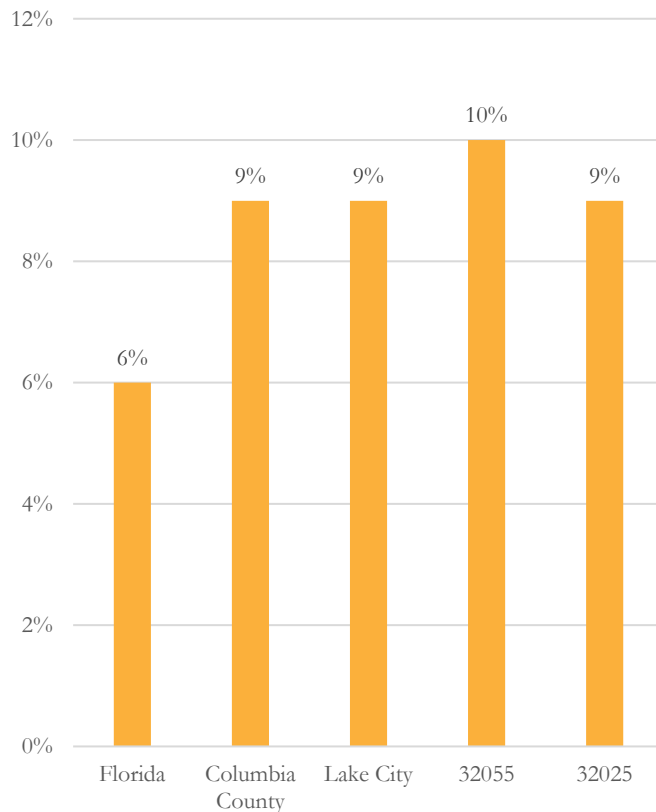
Columbia County Top Jobs by Occupation in 2019
(North FL Economic Development Partnership)



- According to data from the North Florida Economic Development Partnership, the **top industries in Columbia County in 2019 were Health Care and Social Services, Retail, Accommodation and Food Services, and Public Administration.**
- Between 2000 and 2019, the population in Columbia County has **grown by 28.6%.**
- As of 2020, the county's population **increased by 6% since 2015**, growing by 4,125 and it is **projected to increase another 4% over the next five years** adding an additional 2,880 people to the Columbia County population.
- Major employers in the area include the **Veteran's Administration Medical Center** providing more than 1,200 jobs and the **Columbia County School Board** employing over 1,300 people.

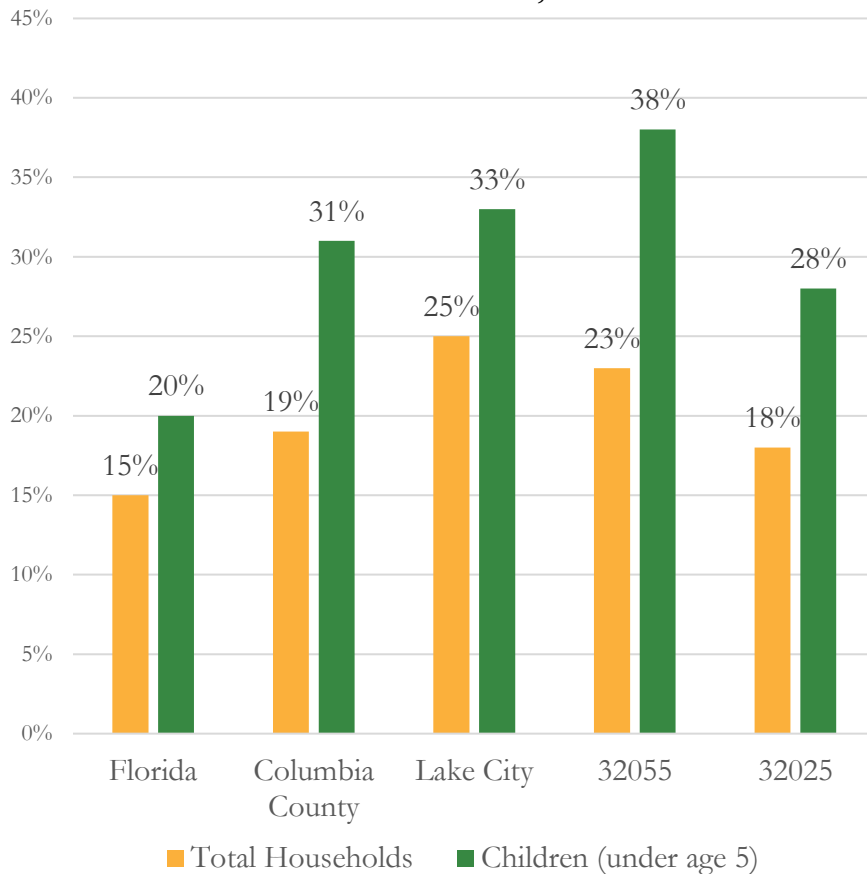
Unemployment Rates (Casey Family Programs Community Opportunity Map)

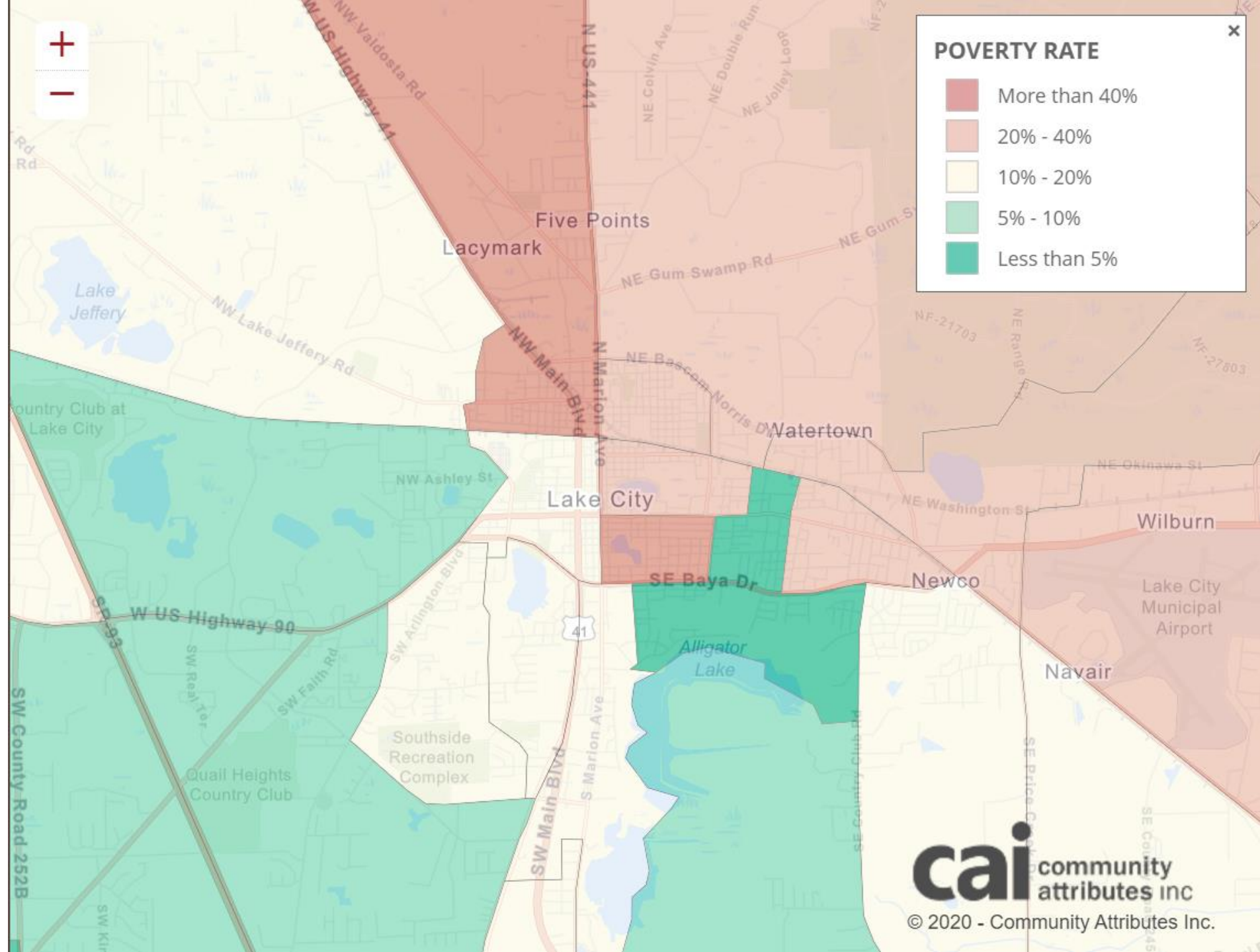
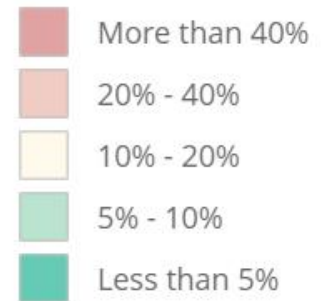
Percentage of Population in Poverty

- The 2019 Columbia County Community Health Assessment indicates that **poverty in Columbia County disproportionately affects Black and Hispanic residents**, with 30.6% of Black residents and 33.2% of Hispanic or Latino residents living in poverty, compared to 13.4% of White residents.
- This disparity is even more stark among children in Columbia County, **with 44% of Black children and 40% of Hispanic or Latino children living in poverty, compared to 18% of White children (Source: Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, Data 2018).**
- ALICE households, meaning Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed, are households that earn less than the basic cost of living for their area but more than the federally defined poverty level. In Columbia County, **32% of households are ALICE. Combined with the 19% of households living in poverty, a total of 51% of households in Columbia County live below the ALICE threshold.**

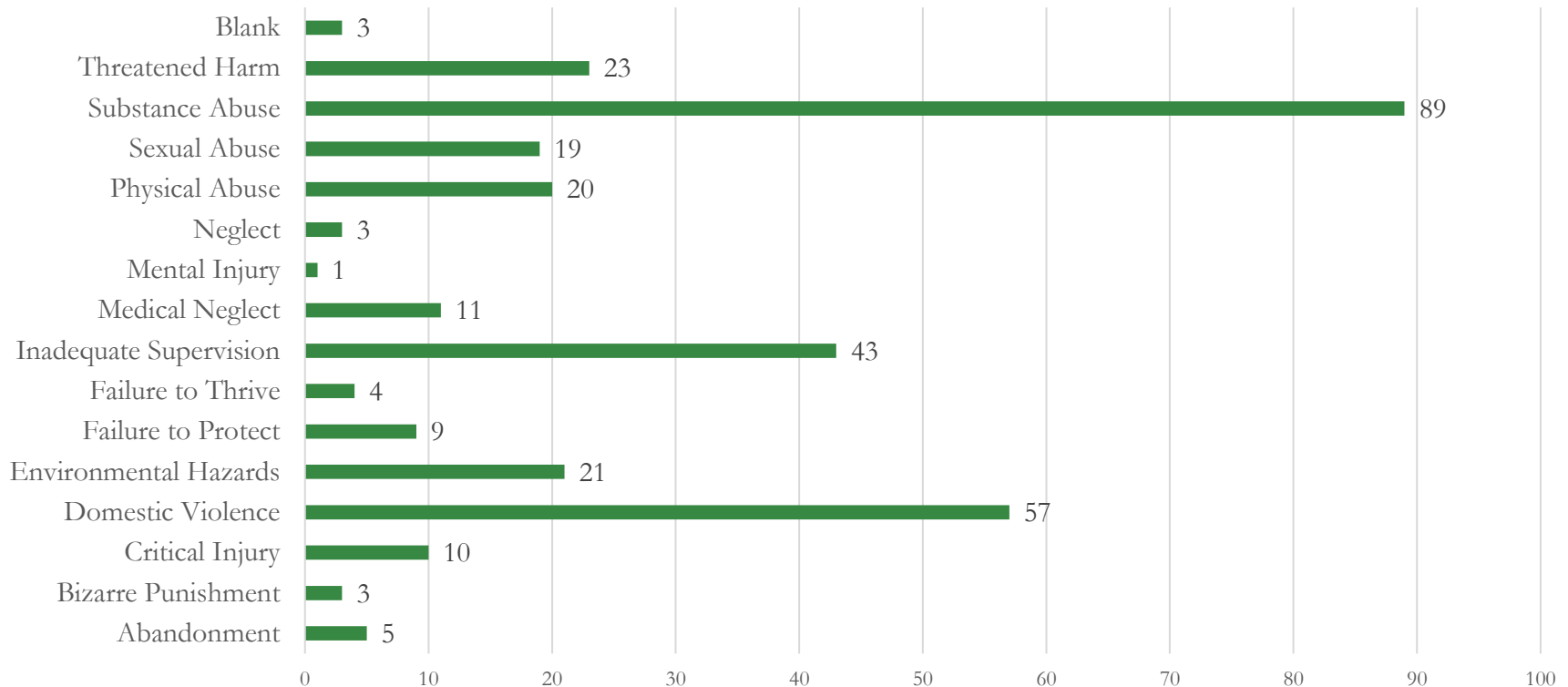

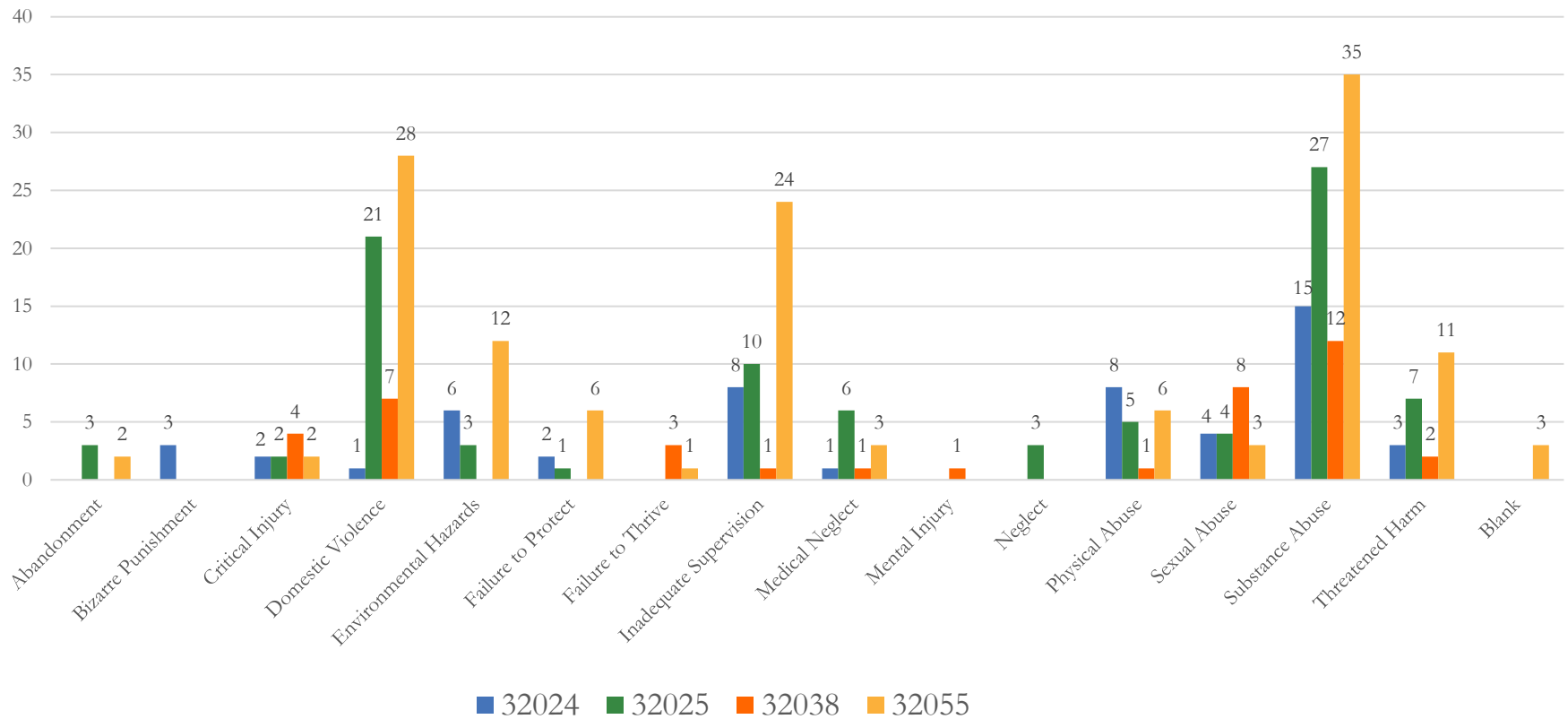
Child Welfare: Child Maltreatment

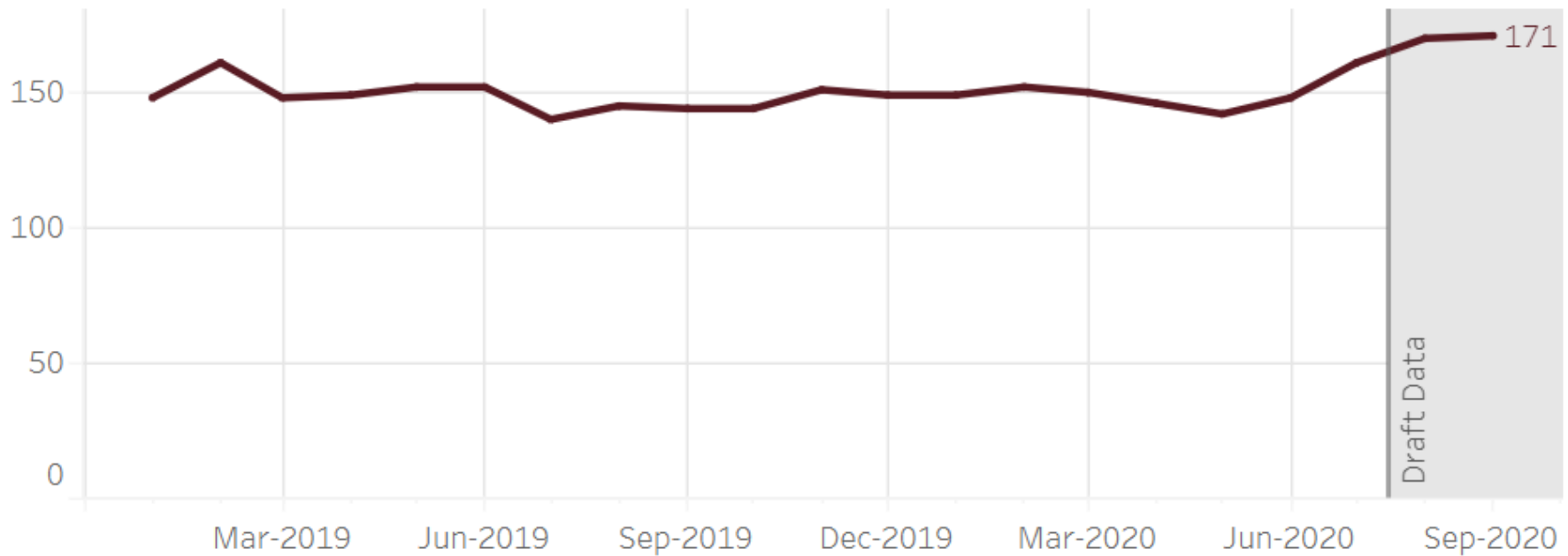
Columbia County Reasons For Shelter By Zip Code

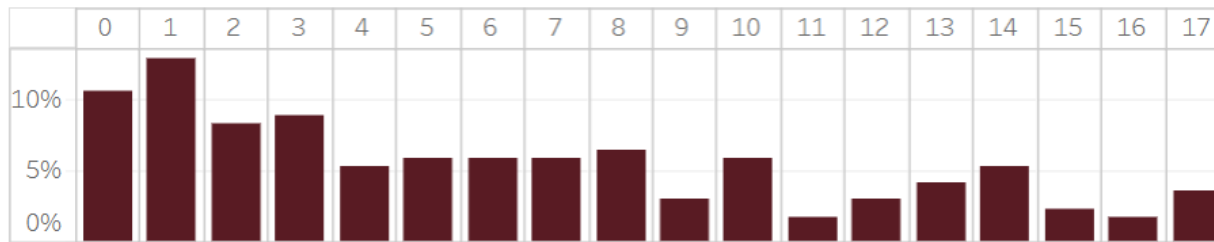


Children in Out-of-Home Care: Placement Type

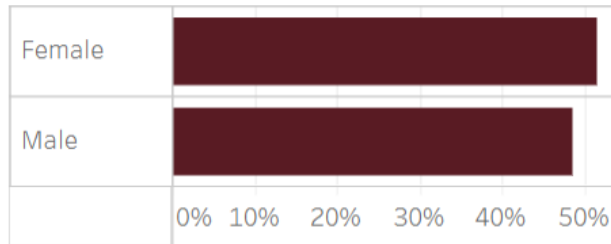

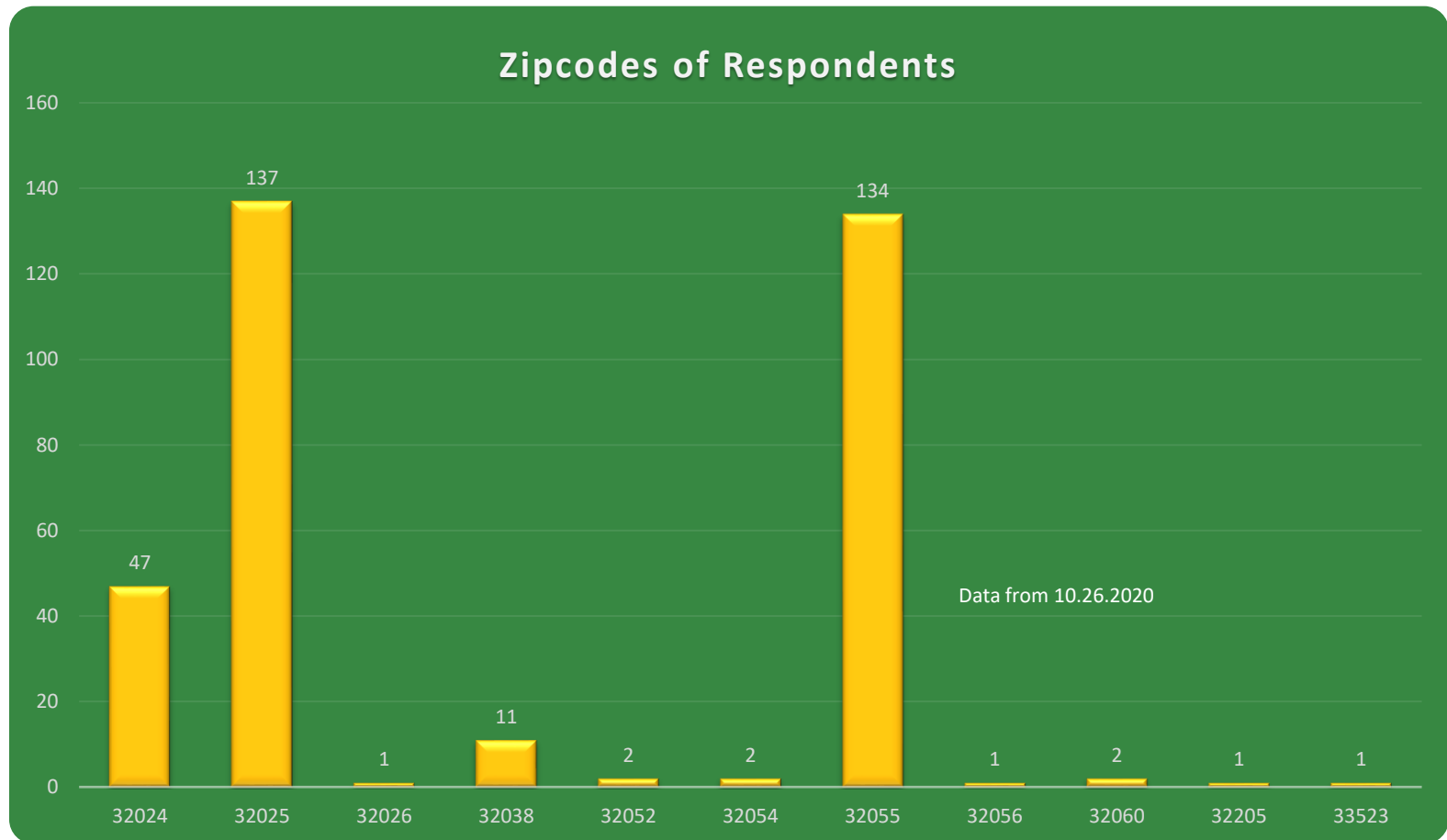

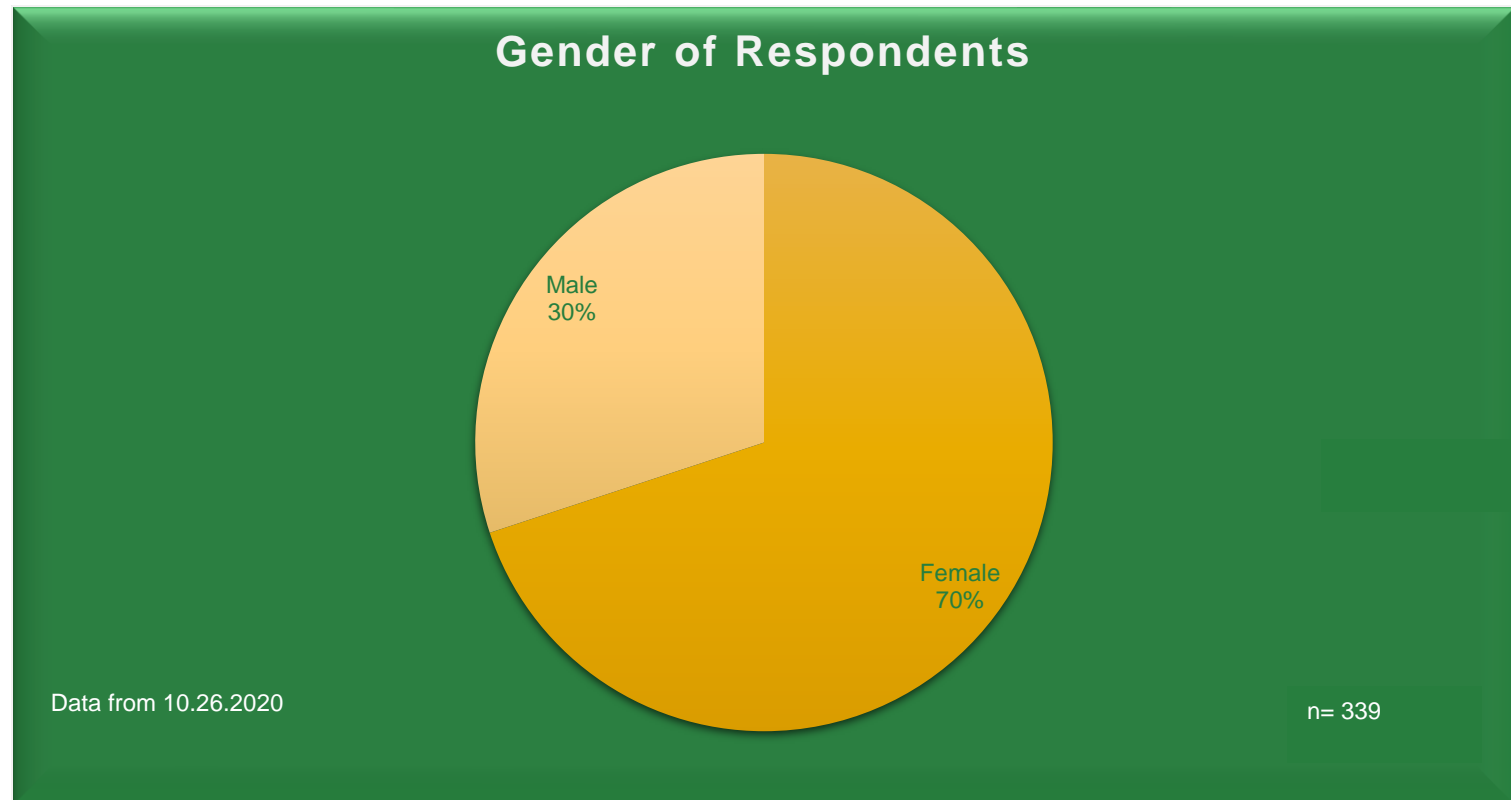
